Sermon Question #4: How should we pray in a pandemic? (Habakkuk 3:1-2)

Discussion #1: What was your biggest take-away from Sunday's sermon?

Discussion #2: What do the majority of your prayers sound like while quarantined?

Discussion #3: Do you find it easier to respond to God rightly in the midst of crisis or just focus on your circumstances? Can you really respond rightly to your circumstances without first responding to God?

Discussion #4: How does God's immutability (unchanging nature) affect us? How should it affect us?

Discussion #5: What would someone's life look like if they were satisfied with merely a secondhand knowledge of God? What would your marriage look like if you only had a secondhand knowledge of your spouse?

Discussion #6: Think carefully about the prophet asking God for revival. What is the difference between revival and salvation? Why are people okay with a secondhand knowledge of God?

Discussion #7: Can we know what the Lord is doing in the midst of these years? How so?

Discussion #8: How can we have our awareness of God (or spiritual sensitivity) increased? How would being aware of God's character and actions change our situation?

Discussion #9: How might the awareness that God is working everything out towards his glory and our good affect us?

Discussion #10: Why might we levy an accusation against God that what's happening isn't fair? Why is that foolish?

Discussion #11: How does Habakkuk's third request remind us of the Gospel?
